The Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, located at 1029 Main Street, in the City of Paterson, County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, by way of a petition, and complaint against the respondents' hereby states:

**COUNT I**

1. The Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, (Aslan), is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of New Jersey. Aslan is the son of the late Tscherim Soobzokov, (Soobzokov). Soobzokov was the victim of a bombing that occurred on August 15, 1985 in Paterson, New Jersey. Soobzokov died on September 6, 1985 due to the injuries he sustained from the bombing.

2. Shortly after the bombing in September 1985, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) initiated an investigation. Now, more than 25 years later, FBI did not arrest anyone for killing Soobzokov. Officially they maintain that the matter is under investigation.
3. The Office of the United States Attorney (USA) supervised and coordinated with FBI on the investigation, and alleged prosecution of the individuals that killed Soobzokov.
4. A bomb was previously mailed to Soobzokov in July 1979 contained in a cigar box, fortunately there were no physical injuries; no arrests were ever made by the respondents'. The FBI and USA were involved in that investigation which did not produce any results.
5. In 1979 the USA sought to denaturalize and deport Soobzokov from the United States but dismissed the denaturalization proceedings in July 1980.
6. On November 21, 2005 Aslan filed a complaint and order to show cause under **Civil Action Number 05-5486 (DRD)** against the respondents in Newark, New Jersey after being advised in writing by the former USA that the Soobzokov investigation was closed. The matter was resolved upon production of an affidavit provided in good faith by FBI stating that the investigation was active and ongoing. More than 5 years since that affidavit was filed, no one has been prosecuted or arrested and for the killing.
7. Subsequently, Aslan requested and received documents from the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), FBI, and the National Archives via the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). A substantial amount of information on Soobzokov was reviewed from the respective agencies.

8. These documents show that the investigation and prosecution of Soobzokov's killers was not actively pursued by the Department of Justice (DOJ), USA, and FBI.
9. It was discovered that FBI provided evidence and made a request to the USA in 1989 to arrest 3 suspects that were directly involved in killing Soobzokov. Exhibit A. The evidence in support of the request by FBI was sufficient to establish probable cause to arrest these individuals. The USA denied the request. These individuals have since departed the United States and now live in Israel.
10. The USA did not issue any warrants to arrest these individuals or seek their extradition to the United States. USA cannot produce any evidence to the contrary. They have not made any attempt to arrest and seek to extradite the killers.
11. Shortly after the bombing of Soobzokov, Aslan was directly told by now retired FBI agent Don K. Clark that they "have evidence and arrests were imminent". But no arrests were ever made. One can conclude that the statement by FBI was untruthful.
12. The FBI has sufficient information to charge 3 individuals but have not done so because they have been detracted by the USA and Department of Justice (DOJ).
13. The DOJ and USA have failed to act in accordance with their sworn duties as outlined under the United States Constitution and Federal Regulations. They have not applied the rule of law fairly and equally.
14. The conduct of the DOJ and USA has violated the Constitutional rights of Soobzokov, petitioner Aslan, and the Soobzokov family.
15. In light of the information gathered from requests made under FOIA, it appears that the integrity of the respondents' is suspect and it is influenced by outside forces that seek to prevent justice in prosecution of the killers.

16. At the time the affidavit was signed as indicated at paragraph 6, above, information was not received from FOIA by Aslan. After reviewing the FOIA material, it is now clear that the **affidavit** provided in 2005 by FBI was **disingenuous** since it was discovered that no action had been taken by the respondents' since 1989. The investigation was not active and ongoing as was suggested by the FBI.
17. The information gathered from FOIA demonstrates that intervention from a Federal Court is required to compel the respondents' to act in accordance with their Constitutional duties. The respondents' must be held accountable for their lack of prosecution of those individuals that murdered Soobzokov. The Court must remove the Soobzokov case to a neutral entity in light of the allegations made here and the history of the case.
18. Eric P. Holder is being sued in this capacity as Attorney General of the United States for his responsibilities in overseeing all United States Attorney's offices, and the FBI.
19. Paul Fishman is being sued in his capacity as United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey, the office that failed to prosecute the killers of Soobzokov. No viable reason can be provided for their failure to act and their deviation from seeking Justice.
20. Robert S. Muller, III, is being sued in his capacity as Director of the FBI for the manner in which the FBI handled and conducted the investigation of the Soobzokov killing. Muller as FBI director has not used the authority of his office to bring the killers to justice. Muller succumbed to political influence which compromised the Soobzokov investigation.

21. Michael B. Ward, FBI Special Agent In Charge of New Jersey is being sued in his capacity as the Supervisory Agent In Charge of the Newark, New Jersey FBI office and assigned to the investigation of the Soobzokov killing. There have been no attempts made by the respondents' to bring the killers to justice. FBI submitted to the USA's illogical order in not arresting the suspects.
22. The respondents individually and collectively have violated 5 USC § 551, more commonly known as The Administrative Procedures Act (APA). This Court has the authority to review the respondents' action or inaction pursuant to 5 USC § 704.
23. The respondents' have violated the Due Process Clause of the 5<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Amendments to the United States Constitution by their failure in bringing the killers to justice, knowing who they are, and where they are located.
24. In light of the lack of action taken by the respondents' in investigating and prosecuting the murderers' of Soobzokov, the Civil Rights of Aslan, and the Soobzokov family have been, and continue to be violated.
25. The petitioner Aslan seeks the assistance of this Honorable Court by way of a Writ of Mandamus, pursuant to 28 USC § 1361, or by way of a Prerogative Writ, to have the respondents' produce evidence to refute the allegations contained within this petition and rule accordingly.
26. The petitioner Aslan seeks the assistance of this Honorable Court by way of the Court's authority to have the evidence in this case reviewed by a neutral body to determine whether the investigation was compromised by the respondents', and whether bias existed.

**WHEREFORE**, Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, hereby demands Judgment against the respondents' for relief and issuance of an Order from this Court as follows:

- a) Compel the respondents' to produce the results of their investigation into the Murder of Tscherim Soobzokov;
- b) Directing the creation of a neutral body to investigate the actions taken by the respondents';
- c) Transfer of the Soobzokov file to a different jurisdiction for investigation and prosecution of the identified suspects;
- d) Award counsel fees and court costs.

**COUNT II**

27. The Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, repeats and restates the allegations contained in the preceding 26 paragraphs and make same apart hereof.

28. The petitioner requests that this Court order an investigation into whether certain officers of the United States Government violated 42 USC §1985, and §1986, during the course of the investigation into Soobzokov's murder. There is evidence that the investigation was influenced by bias and outside influence which the respondents' yielded to, contrary to their Constitutional duties and Federal Regulations.

**WHEREFORE**, the Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, hereby demands judgment against the respondents' and requests that this Court:

- a) Direct that an independent inquiry is formed to investigate whether the respondents' violated Federal law.
- b) Award counsel fees and court costs.

c) Any other remedy that the Court deems appropriate.

### COUNT III

29. The petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, repeats and restates the allegations contained in the preceding 28 paragraphs and make same apart hereof.
30. During the 25 years since the killing of Soobzokov, the respondents' have not provided any relevant information to Aslan and the Soobzokov family on the alleged investigation.
31. Upon receipt of documents via the Freedom of Information Act it was apparent that the petitioner and the Soobzokov family were misled by the respondents'. They were never advised that the investigation was dormant for decades.
32. The petitioner never knew that killers were indentified for arrest and that the respondents' failed to act. The suspects have since moved to Israel with no action taken to extradite the suspects. The actions of the USA permitted the perpetrators to flee the United States and escape from justice.
33. The facts establish that the respondents' violated the Civil Rights of Aslan as outlined under 42 USC § 1983, and the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution due to the substandard treatment of Aslan and the Soobzokov family in the investigation of the Soobzokov Murder.
34. The manner in which the respondents' treated Aslan and the Soobzokov family did not take into account that they were victims. They were not treated with respect by the respondents' considering their victim status.



**WHEREFORE**, the Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, hereby demands judgment against the respondents' for an independent investigation of the actions taken by the DOJ, USA, and FBI, and for damages, counsel fees, court costs, and any relief deemed appropriate from this Court.

**COUNT IV**

35. The Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, repeats and restates the allegations contained in the preceding 34 paragraphs and makes same apart hereof.
36. The respondents' and their predecessors had been historically involved in attempting to harm Soobzokov, initially by seeking to deport Soobzokov from the United States. During the same time they were involved in investigating the first attempted bombing. These factors clearly establish a conflict of interest by the respondents' in that they sought to deport Soobzokov and were responsible for investigating the first bombing which they clearly have failed to do. They were on notice since 1979 that Soobzokov was a target but failed to take any protective action. Six years later Soobzokov was killed when a second bomb detonated at his home. FBI had been on notice of impending harm to Soobzokov.
37. It is apparent that the respondents' did not conduct a meaningful and comprehensive investigation into the Soobzokov killing. It is evident that their lack of action was a direct result of a conflict of interest. The man they unsuccessfully tried to deport was killed, without any substantive investigation conducted by the respondents'. The end result is a cold case and dereliction of duty on the part of the respondents'.
38. While the events described in the preceding paragraphs were occurring, Soobzokov was continuously defamed by the media. When the media witnessed the respondents'

lack of action in apprehending the known killers, they assumed that the allegations made against Soobzokov had some merit. As a result they continuously print and have printed articles harming Soobzokov's reputation and now his memory. The respondents' cannot escape complicity in this regard.

39. The unjustified and repeated attacks in the media toward Soobzokov caused Aslan and the Soobzokov family extreme emotional pain. The arrogance of the media comes from their witnessing the respondents' lack interest toward the investigation of the killing of Soobzokov.

**WHEREFORE**, the Petitioner, Aslan T. Soobzokov, hereby demands judgment against the Respondents' for a declaration that there was a conflict of interest on the part of the Respondents' in the matter of Soobzokov by DOJ, USA, and the FBI for damages, counsel fees, court costs and any relief the Court deems appropriate.

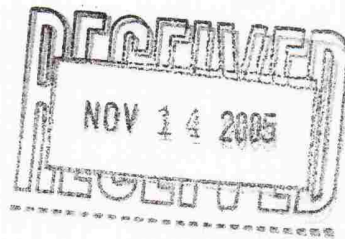



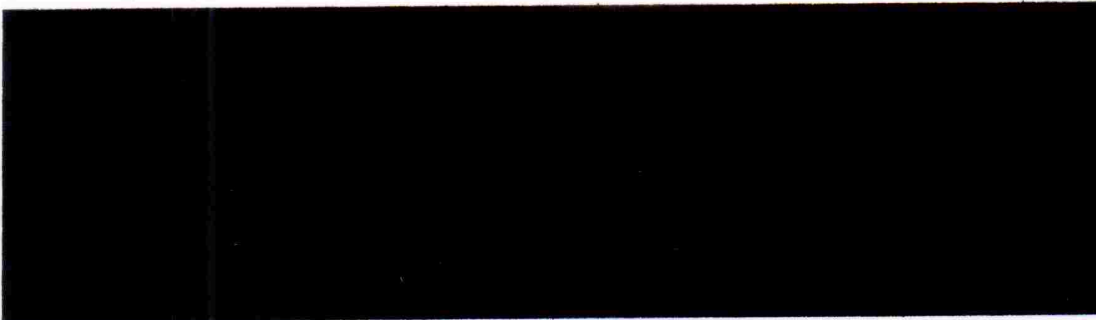

She needed medical attention and he ran down the street toward BARNERT HOSPITAL. Pursuant to our telephone conversation concerning Tscherim Soobzokov's case and your first page news article in the Herald News of Monday, March 21, 1983, I take this opportunity to bring to your attention some additional facts. Your article covered the oral argument in Judge Gerard Goettel's Federal court room in New York on Friday, March 18, 1983 fairly and accurately. The eight-year background of this case is intricate and complex. The paper work ~~used~~ documentary evidence is so voluminous as to defy any cursory comments. Below are some highlights:

Attorney Herman W. Steinberg and I were the first attorneys to advise Soobzokov on his rights in this matter some six years ago. As a result, the services of Attorney Michael F. Dennis of New York were obtained for the institution of a libel suit in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York.

Steinberg and I were in the Federal Courtroom of Judge Goettel in September, 1982 when a motion for summary judgment was argued by Mr. Dennis and the lawyers for the defendants.

That motion is pending disposition by the District Court. The attempt by the defense to take depositions in the Soviet Union is an indication that they are attempting to establish an additional fact issue. This will be highly persuasive factor to the Court and will undoubtedly result in a denial of defendant's motion for summary judgment. The fact is that the defense was in possession of the information now being sought in the Soviet Union almost four years ago in 1979 when agents of the United States Attorney for the Southern District went to the Soviet Union in an attempt to prove that Soobzokov was a Nazi war criminal. That Grand Jury investigation was concluded after 21 months and after many witnesses were heard.

The result: The United States Attorney informed Soobzokov's attorney that the Grand Jury had heard the evidence and

returned no indictment.

The chronology of events during the past eight years from 1975 to 1983 will place the events leading to this case now pending, in proper perspective.

1. 1975 The Immigration and Naturalization Service of the United States (I.N.S.) conducted a world-wide investigation concerning Soobzokov's entry into the United States. His alleged affiliation with the Nazis, and the declaration made on his application for a visa were extensively checked, and he was cleared of any wrongdoing in 1975.
2. 1974-1976 During the period 1974 to 1976 United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey, Herbert Stein, (now a Federal Judge) and subsequently, his successor United States Attorney Jonathan Goldstein conducted investigations into the same allegations and others and the result was that the investigations were closed.
3. 1977-1978 Soobzokov was the subject of a 21 months' investigation beginning about March 1977 and concluding on January 1, 1979 when the life of that Grand Jury was terminated. The United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York on May 17, 1979 informed Soobzokov's attorney that this Federal Grand Jury had heard evidence from witnesses concerning him and returned no indictment.
4. 1978 Soobzokov brought his civil action for libel against C.B.S., the New York Times and the author of the book, Howard Blum in 1978.
5. 1979-1980 On December 6, 1979 after another intensive investigation, a civil complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey by the U.S. Department of Justice (Criminal Division, Office of Special Investigations). In essence, this complaint sought to proceed against Soobzokov as a Nazi war criminal and as a Nazi collaborator. On July 7, 1980 this case was dismissed by the Court on motion of the Government "with prejudice". The effect of this determination was that the Government could not in the future seek to deport Soobzokov or revoke his citizenship.
6. 1981 Finally on January 28, 1981 the U.S. Department of Justice informed his New York attorney that its investigation conducted by Allan A. Ryan, Jr. Director, Office of Special Investigations, Washington, D.C. had been concluded and "after a careful review of the results no further action was intended against him."

As I promised, I am enclosing a copy of all relevant materials on the Soobzokov case, together with the statement I issued on July 9, 1980.

You will note that on page 2 of that statement I reiterated my intent to file new charges against Soobzokov if our investigation revealed sufficient evidence of persecution. As I told you in New York, that investigation has since been carried out, including face-to-face interrogation in the Soviet Union by my staff, of potential witnesses, and I have concluded that there is insufficient evidence on which to base charges of persecution.

Regarding the Trifa case, I thought you might be interested in seeing the latest pleading we filed in the Sixth Circuit, reiterating our demand that the court dismiss Trifa's appeal forthwith. I will, of course, inform Dr. Kremer immediately when we learn of the Court's decision.

Finally, I enclose a copy of the latest summary of our cases in litigation. This sets forth the status of each of the 19 cases we are now litigating in federal and immigration courts.





On arriving at that location I was met by Sgt. Carraba, Officer Sims, Mr. Soobzokov, Fire personnel from Engine Company #10 under the direction of Chief Bakakauskar. From speaking with Officer Sims it was learned that at 5:12pm this date he was dispatched to 704 14th Ave on the report of a bomb threat. Upon his arrival he met Mr. Soobzokov who showed him a brown square package taped up along with a note unsigned addressed to Mr. Soobzokov. Officer Sims then examined and opened the package enough to observe what appeared to be traces of gun powder on the inside of the wrapping. Officer Sims then notified headquarters who dispatched Unit #125 Sgt. Carraba who then requested the detectives. This writer was directed to the living room of Mr. Soobzokov home and on the dining room table this writer observed a brown cigar box and thru the opening it could be observed that the box was set with some type of button, which was black in color. This writer then informed the officer along with Sgt. Carraba as well as the Fire Department personnel that this could possibly be a bomb and that it should not have been touched by anyone.

This writer then radioed headquarters to contact the bureau to have the proper authorities regarding this box suspected of being a bomb. A short time later this writer received communications that Dover Arsenal in Tinny had been notified and that it would be sometime before they could respond. Due to the fact that the box was partially opened Chief Bakakauskar requested that the box be moved to a safer place where there was no immediate danger to human life. He then requested that Fire Alarm be set up, a bomb blanket and after it arrived the box was placed in the trunk of a detective sedan 406 and along with an escort it was conveyed to the valley of the rocks where it was placed in a secluded area awaiting

the arrival of the Picatinny bomb squad. While at the valley of the rocks this writer received radio communications that the Picatinny bomb squad could not make it due to their vehicle being disabled. Contact was then made with Sgt. Chapman of the Fort Ramoth Division and after being informed of the circumstances he stated that he would dispatch a unit immediately. This writer after securing the valley of the rocks area with police personnel then returned to the bureau. A short while later at 7:03pm a Sgt. Robinson entered the bureau and stated that he was from the Dover Picatinny Arsenal and that he was here for the box allegedly containing the bomb. This writer then accompanied Sgt. Robinson along with Sgt. Reistel to the valley of the rocks. There they were shown the box along with its unknown contents. They stated that they were going to place a detonator near the box to blow it and then check to see what evidence could be recovered. After setting their charge near the box the box was then blown into pieces. After the explosion had cleared we found the following items from the contents of the box. 1- Black object with 2 lead connectors with 2 screws attached and on top of the object a push in an out type button, 1-Eveready 9 Volt Heavy Duty battery with yellow wiring attached to the positive and negative terminals of the battery which was wrapped in some type of brown sticky tape. The items were turned over to this writer and later conveyed back to the bureau where they were listed on PPT#20499.

Arriving back at the bureau this writer made the following notifications. S.I. Agent Jack Mc Cannon phone number 622-5613 and it was learned that their office had already been contacted by Mr. Soobzokov and that they would be doing a follow up investigation. A call was then placed to the Division of Alcohol & Firearms and there I was connected to a Bob Wagner and he stated that he would have to consult with his supervisor and that he would call back as soon as he had done this. A short while later I received a phone call from Bob Wagner and he stated that he would be responding to this office. I informed him that I would await his arrival. A call was then made to the Prosecutors Office and I spoke with Marty Lane at his home and he stated that he would contact the personnel who was on call for this type of assignment. A short while later I received a phone call from Frank Pinello and he was advised of the investigation thus far and stated that he would respond to the bureau on Saturday June 12 where he would meet this writer concerning this matter.

Upon the arrival of Bob Wagner to this office he was apprised of the investigation thus far. He stated that his office if needed would take the recovered property to his lab and that they would do the necessary test on the recovered property to see if they could come up with some type of lead as to who had made or sent the bomb. He was advised that this would have to be done when the Prosecutors Office had checked into this matter.

It should be noted that I.D. Officer Walt Tilton took photos of the box before it was destroyed by the bomb squad.

Bob Wagner then requested that he be taken to the home of the complainant and this was done by detective Pegg.

All evidence recovered was placed on Property tags and placed in the property book and will be held until it has been determined who has jurisdiction over these items.

This investigation will continue.



It has been difficult to receive support from individuals who know that my father is innocent, you see sir they fear repercussions may develop for aiding a accused Nazi War Criminal.

These accusations were stated in major newspapers, by a major television network about "Nazi War Criminals living in the United States," on this program my fathers name was shown on the screen and the city in which we reside.

A book was published by a major book publishing company accusing my father as being a War Criminal. To combat this injustice we have filed law suits against these major companys. We keep facing delays or postponments for various reasons. We are notified of investigations being started and see no end to them. This has occured a few times, when we inquire about the progress fo the investigation we are sent running in circles.

There is no proof or truth to these allegations sir, yet they continue to harass us, they are violating our rights as Americans.

I have just returned from a ten day leave sir, and I see my family slowly losing their faith in our country. Serving my country in the United States Air Force its extremely diffcult for me to see my father and family suffer and their health deteriorate. One of our orders in serving in the military is to protect the rights of individuals and yet my family's rights are being violated and nothing is being done about it. The question comes up, Can major companys falsely accuse a American and be successful because of their wealth and power?

Mr. President, I feel our case is very important to the average American living in our great country. I thank you Mr. President for your time and anticipated assistance.

Your letter rogatory addressed to the Prosecution Frankenthal, dated June 23, 1977, has been forwarded for reasons of competence to the Prosecution Stuttgart, since the inquiries against Walter Kehrer are carried out at present by the Prosecution Stuttgart.

No indications could be found in the investigation files of the proceedings against Walter Kehrer, as to the person and the criminal acts of the Accused Tscherim Soobzokov. There is only the photostatic copy of a list dated March 13, 1945 with names of officers who were taken over to the Waffen-SS. The name of the Accused Soobzokov is recorded among other names. However, according to your letter rogatory, you have this list already on hand. The Prosecution Stuttgart has at present no further knowledge concerning Soobzokov.

I regret that I am not able to give you more detailed information.

My honorable beloved father Tscherim Soobzokov was assassinated in 1985 when a bomb was placed on the door step of our home in Paterson, New Jersey. No one was apprehended by the federal government who had taken over the investigation from local authorities. The reasons for their lack of success are not because of malfeasance or incompetence, it is due to reasons which run in the face of the rule of law. In my journey to ensure my father's life was not forgotten, I have followed all lawful protocols to find justice but without success. No one cares and there is no doubt that there are some bad people, or at least, some dishonorable people in our government. If you are willing to help me, please ask DOJ for the hidden files on my father. If you come to know the truth about what "they" did to my father, being the man that you are, there is no doubt that justice will no longer be compromised.

In my quest for justice on behalf of my late father every avenue proscribed by the United State Constitution has been exhausted. The federal courts have consistently and unequivocally stated that my only recourse for justice must be addressed to you. The court stated in their opinion, when my petition was denied, that the executive branch must intervene. Therein the injustice endured by my father and our family is addressed to you. Therefore, once again I reach out to you a third time for help.

On two prior occasions over the last decade I requested your assistance. Initially while you were a United States Senator on October 14, 2005, and on July 10, 2009 after you became President of the United States. You had not responded. The department of justice was contacted over successive administrations who were not responsive at all. In fact the actions taken by DOJ are circumspect. Subsequently I sought the assistance of the judiciary. After an exhaustive process in the federal courts was completed, it is

without dispute at this point that only you, Mr. President, have the constitutional authority and ability to intercede and order that justice is established for my father. The killers must be brought to justice, and my father's name and reputation that was tarnished by DOJ over the years must be exonerated by the United States government. Please note that my family and I to this day are victims of hatred and attacks by people that subscribe to the allegations lodged by DOJ.

It is obvious now that our government has lied to me and my family for 28 years about the investigation onto the killing of my father which violated our constitutional rights. After all these years my days on earth are limited. Please allow me to achieve justice for my beloved father and regain the belief that there is in fact justice in America.

This is not a request for anything of material value, favor, gift, or charity. It is my humble plea to a man that was blessed by our Lord to lead this great nation. Everyone at every forum that we confronted over the years turned away from doing what God required them to do, please Mr. President, quietly put them in shame.

With the grace of Almighty Allah (SWT) this letter will find its way to your blessed hands. All praises are for almightily God.

I, the undersigned ILIAS KHUSHT, being duly sworn according to law, upon my oath, depose and say that:

1. I reside at Jabel El-Taj, Amman, Jordan since 1947.
2. I was born on 1904 in Aul Shendji, Tachtamukais Taion A.A.O., U.S.S.R.
3. I know Tschirim Seobzokov and his father and mother, Kurach nee Dedi, very well.
4. Upon German Liberation of Tachtamukai area, he was chosen by the area people as official of the Circassian Gandarmeria, namely as Secretary to the Chief, Mr. Mahmeud Chez.
5. After a short period, Mr. Seobzokov was removed from his position for refusing the Germans the presentation of certain documents, or information concerning his towns-people. Also his Chief was replaced by another Circassian by name, Ghach.
6. Later on, Mr. Tschirim Seobzokov joined the North Circassian Voluntary batalion and was appointed as an Assistant Supply Officer.
7. We never saw him or heard of him, doing anything wrong to any person or persons.
8. He was always helpful to anyone to whom he could provide political, or moral assistance during the time when the Germans were in our area.
9. I knew nothing, if anything, was done by him from when we retreated from Krasnodarki Krai, until the end of World War II in 1945.
10. Only, I very well remember that after World War II, he was held very highly, respected by our leaders and people, and I never heard anybody speaking against him.
11. Mr. Tschirim Seobzokov, who saved us from forced repatriation in 1945 in Austria, as well as from Italy, in 1946 and 1947.
12. Mr. Seobzokov, who brought us to the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan has saved our lives.

- 1- I reside at Rase El Ein Amman, Jordan.
- 2- I was born on 1909 in aul Tachtamukai, A. A. O., U. S. S. R.
- 3- I know Tcherim Soobzokov, since his childhood.
- 4- In 1940 or 1941, he was arrested and was sentenced to one year imprisonment.
- 5- Shortly after declaration of war by the Germans, he came back to our native town, Tachtamukai and was mobilized with many young boys of his age group to build defense lines.
- 6- In the Summer of 1942, a few months before German occupation, he came back, being wounded on his shoulder and was under treatment in the town hospital.
- 7- Tcherim Soobzokov, chose not to retreat with retreating Kraenoe Armia, but stayed back waiting for coming Germans.
- 8- In August 1942, upon German liberation of our town Tachtamukai, he was one of those selected by towns people to set up self-ruling local government under German Agricultural Commandant, and he was assigned as a secretary to then Chief of the Circassian Gendarmeria in Tachtamukai, Raion, Mahmoud Chez.
- 9- After a month or two, Mahmoud Chez and Tcherim Soobzokov were removed from their positions for refusing Germans in presenting list of former members of Communist Party, Comsomol, and activists.
- 10- Tcherim Soobzokov joined voluntarily, North Caucassian infantry batalion which was formed somewhere from former prisoners of war consisting of Adige, Kabardines, Chechens, Karachays, Ingushes, and Dagestanians.
- 11- That batalion was fighting against Kraenoe Armis in Maslovka near Staniza Kalujanskia, about 25 kilometers from our town, Tachtamukai.
- 12- Tcherim Soobzokov, was appointed there as an assistant to Supply Officer, and we used to see him at least once a week and sometimes twice a week with a few carts used for taking from different villages hay for army horses.
- 13- In February 1943, I saw him retreating with his batalion and many Germans from the city of Kraenodar.
- 14- Again I saw him in the Summer of 1943 with two other Circassian Soldiers in Staniza Partizani near the city of Militopol, Ukraine, where we were quartered as civilian refugees.
- 15- In the Winter of 1943, we civilians were organized in so called self-defense units and were set up to fight partizans in Slonim area in Belorussia. All this time, his brother Nos was with us and he was sick with tuberculosis.
- 16- In January or February of 1944, Tcherim Soobzokov came to us in Slonim and under false pretences that he was taking us to join Caucassian Army; took 5 persons from our native town.
- 17- Since then, we travelled together, our group increasing. This group consisted of those who did not wish to fight partizans or work for Germans, and we were trying to avoid contact with Tcherkeski Bejenski Comitee under leadership of Nanu Chadijemeukov and his stooges.
- 18- The countries we travelled together are Ukraine, Rumania, Hungaria, Yugoslavia, Greece, Austria and to Poland.

A larger group of JDL members demonstrated outside of Soobzokov's 14th Avenue Paterson home in early April. They have also protested outside the East Hills, Long Island home of Michael Dennis, Soobzokov's attorney.

Soobzokov is the subject of a federal grand jury investigation based on allegations that he served with a unit of collaborators assembled by the Germans shortly after they invaded Caucasia, Russia.

Author Charles R. Allen, in his book, "Nazi War Criminals Among Us," claims to have discovered documents presented at the Nuremberg trials that list Soobzokov as having served with the 800th Battalion of the North Caucasus National Legion, of which units assisted Nazis in exterminating Communists, Jews, gypsies and others.

but a growing crowd of Paterson police stood between the two groups and the demonstration remained orderly.

The protest was identical to one in early April when the JDL gathered in front of Soobzokov's Paterson home one night. The group has also demonstrated outside the home of his attorney, Michael Dennis, in East Hills, L.I.

Leading the protest yesterday, Bonnie Pechter, JDL national director, said the group would keep coming back and has scheduled a repeat demonstration in front of his house at the end of the month.

"This is just the beginning," she said. "As long as Soobzokov works here, we'll be back."

Pechter said the JDL wanted to make the county purchasing inspector as uncomfortable as possible, adding, "for him to be working here and no one to say anything is an obscenity."

With the demonstration made up mostly of people from New York who came by bus, Pechter said she did not know why the local Jewish community has never joined in protest.

"There are, unfortunately, Jews who never learn," she commented. "If we the victims remain silent, how can we expect others to say anything?"

During the demonstration, Soobzokov was at the county jail checking over a shipment of shirts.

"I can't let the hoodlums stop my duties," he said later.

The purchasing inspector said he did not avoid the group but was on his way out when the JDL members pulled up by bus.

Soobzokov, who has always maintained his innocence, said he was not concerned for his safety in spite of the angry chants and added he had the support of many fellow county employees.

County Administrator Joseph Lazzara, a friend of Soobzokov's com-

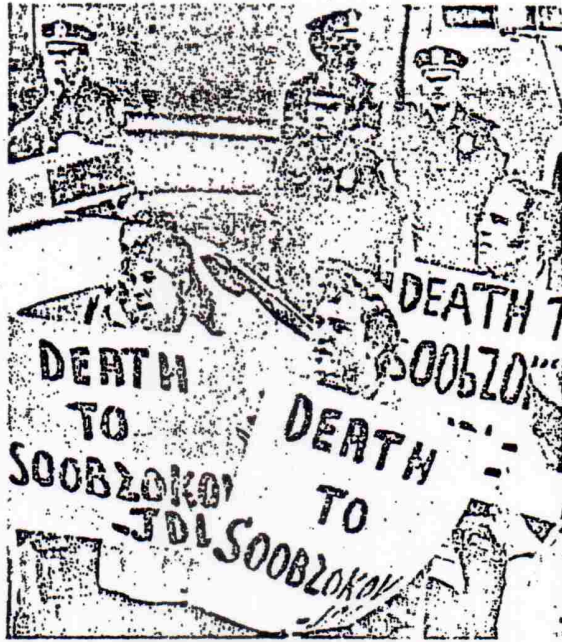

mented during the protest that the group outside was entitled to say what they felt, but said the incident was interfering with the running of the building.

"Most of the employees are out-gawking," he complained. The administrator said he was

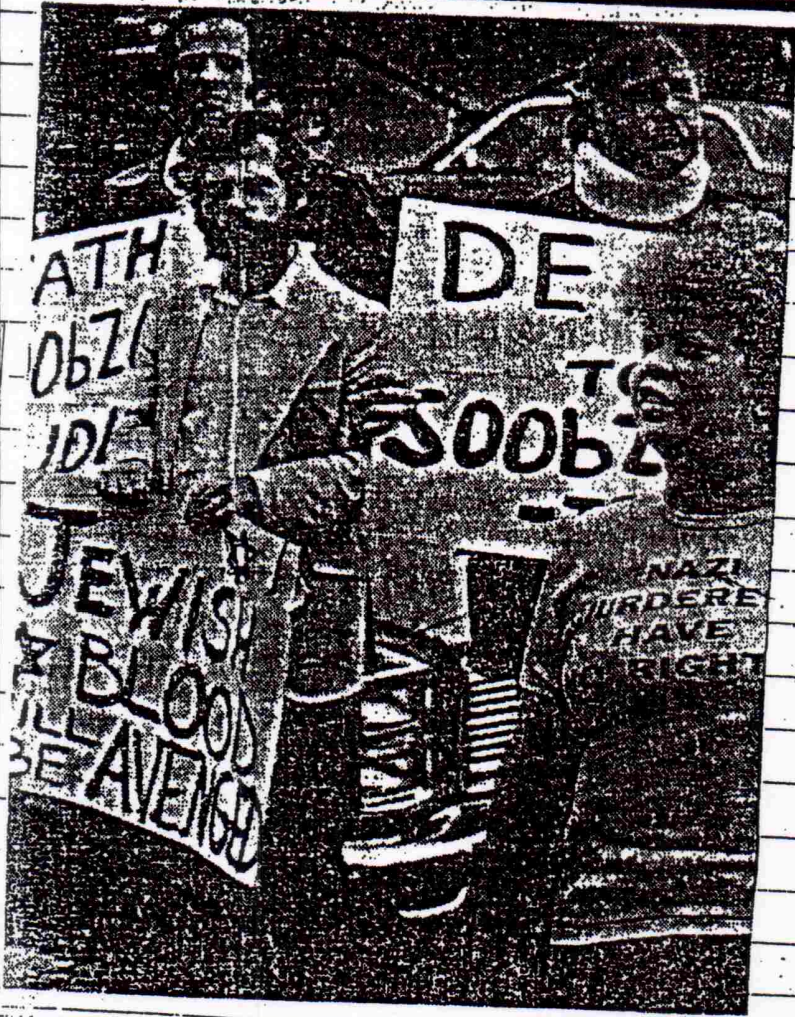
aware of the suffering and anguish felt over the Nazi atrocities committed during the war, but said Soobzokov should have his day in court.

## JDL anti-Nazi rally sparks confrontation

PATERSON — A small band of Jewish Defense League demonstrators almost shouted out of town Wednesday night in a counter group claiming support for accused ex-Nazi Tscherim Soobzokov.

The JDL demonstration, originally scheduled to last 90 minutes, according to a spokesman, was abruptly halted after roughly more than an hour.

Manny Beck, a JDL protest leader, said at the demonstration accomplished what we set out to do.

HE ADMITTED BEING somewhat shocked at the number of sympathizers

who showed up outside Soobzokov's home on the Eastside to support him.

"I take it back, I'm not shocked," Beck said. "It shows how short peoples' memories are to what extent the American government will go to support a war criminal."

The demonstration, according to JDL people, was aimed at focusing national attention to the fact that Soobzokov remains unpunished for his alleged war crimes during World War II.

Soobzokov is chief investigator in the Passaic County Purchasing Department.

The estimated 40 JDL protesters were targets of boos and catcalls from an equal number of counter-demonstrators calling

themselves the North American Caucasian Community.

YAHIAN KAZAN, a group leader, said that the makeshift counter rally called to demonstrate to the JDL Soobzokov's innocence or guilt will be determined in the court and not by protests.

He accused the JDL of "abusing freedom of the country in which they are living," adding that only hatred is the product of such demonstrations.

## Soobzokov House Picketed By JDL

There was a confrontation the early part of this month of high drama played not on a stage but on a street in Paterson, superintended by the city's police and eerily acted out by Jewish Partisans. The drama took one hour to run its course, the producer says it will be repeated even though it was not a box office success. The price of admission is gratis, the drama has no title that will ever be advertised in any theatrical journal but you can check its next appearance by watching for the catchword which is "Never Again." The drama was the JDL in action. What was taking place was something far different than most Jews have imagined about the JDL, it was a bivouac action, it was not an antidote to hate, instead it was a challenge to an indifferent complacency that has afflicted Americans, not just Jews.

The JDL was picketing Tasherim Soobzokov's home. To those who do not know who Soobzokov is a note of enlightenment is needful. He is a former Circassian who when

the Germans took over that land in the 1940's left with the German forces and he is alleged to have become part of the Waffen SS whose job it was to exterminate Jews. After much wandering he wound up in Amman, Jordan and from there finally emigrated to the U.S. He became an American citizen in the 50's, he is now an important individual in Passaic county working in a state office. There is an investigation by the INS and other government groups as to his past alleged Nazi affiliations and the question is did he falsify his application to enter this country.

If he did he is liable to be deported. The hearings on Soobzokov have been going on for some time; he has been written up extensively in the Star Ledger, magazine articles have been authored by Charles Allen, Jr., America's Chief Nazi Documentator, giving extensive background data on him, a book on Nazis mentions him and as a result the author of the book Howard Blum, a N.Y. Times reporter, and the publishers are being sued for ten million dollars in a libel action.

The JDL wants to get Soobzokov out of the country claiming he is a Nazi. Now you have the background.

The JDL had announced it
